



Chairperson's Report


Tēnā koutou katoa

As in 2017, the Māori Education Trust continued to focus on increasing assistance to students, improving students' ability to apply for and access assistance, and on the Trust's ability to provide a high level of scholarship management.

In an effort to provide the best scholarship service possible to students, their whānau and donors, the Trust continued to review and evaluate its administration procedures, sought investment advice in order to grow its funding base, moved to office space in Lower Hutt, and welcomed the completion of stage one of the Trust's new website.

Ka mua; ka muri - looking backwards to inform the future

It is incumbent on us that as we move forward, we look back to those who have led us to this place in time. We hold strong to their vision; we seek to continue their good works; and accept their challenge to secure a future for those who are yet to come.

In 1961, as a result of recommendations contained in the Hunn Report, Government approved the establishment of the Maori Education Foundation to be managed by the Education Department. The purpose of the Foundation was "to finance a full post-primary and university education for many more Māoris [sic] by a system of competitive scholarships". (Maori Education Foundation First Annual Report 1962).

The 1962 Annual Report acknowledged the launch on 26 March 1962 at a ceremony in Parliament Buildings and the fund-raising efforts carried out by 23 voluntary provincial committees which raised £149,800. Government, Māori and non-Māori from around the country together contributed funds to enable the Foundation to provide scholarships. However it was the "interest and concern aroused in the public mind at the position of the Maori in our society" that was noted as more important than the funds raised.

In 1962, the Board considered 197 applications for assistance; 92 awards valued at £5,316 were disbursed to recipients. The following year, the Board considered 842 applications and made 312 awards valued at £28,613.

With the Māori Education Foundation (Abolition) Act 1993, came the end of the Foundation. On 29 Pipiri (June) 1993, the Māori Education Trust came into effect by Deed of Trust. Chaired by John Bennett [Sir], other Trustees were: Maris O'Rourke; Wiremu Kaua [Archdeacon]; Graham Latimer [Sir]; Areta Koopu [CBE]; Rose Pere [Dr]; Wira Gardiner [Sir] and Bruce Gregory [Dr]. (Note: Most titles bestowed post-Board membership.)

Sir John Bennett was both a Trustee of the Foundation and Trust from 1975 until the late 1990s, and served as Chair from 1975 – 1994.

We are grateful for the vision and groundwork laid for the organisation by the endeavours of many. Subsequent Trustees, donors and staff have continued to work to achieve the organisation's purpose.

Chairperson, Monita Delamere (Te Whānau-a-Apanui, Te Whakatōhea and Ngāi Tahu). Mo is a chartered accountant with wide experience in public practise and the corporate world, and has deep experience in governance roles in education. In 1962 he was the recipient of a grant from the Māori Education Foundation to help with his accountancy studies. No reira, ngā mihi ki a rātou ngā tīpuna i whakatō te kākano o tenei roopu.

Dame Iritana Tawhiwhirangi (Ngāti Porou, Ngāti Kahungunu, Ngāpuhi, English and Canadian), MBE and DNZM. Dame Iritana is a member of a number of Advisory Boards including: the Māori Education Trust; Police Commissioner's Māori Forum; Ako Aotearoa, member; Maori Women's Welfare League, Life Member; Adjunct Professor of Te Wānanga o Aotearoa and Patron of the Stem Cell Foundation. She is also a member of King Tuheitia Tekaumaru.

Over the years, she has travelled internationally speaking on Te Kohanga Reo, education and community development. Dame Iritana became a Dame Companion of the New Zealand Order of Merit in 2009 for services to Māori education. In Hōngongoi (July) 2018, she received Māori Television's Te Toi o Nga Rangi Lifetime Achievement Award.

Bronwyn Yates (Rongowhakaata, Te Aitanga ā Māhaki, Te Arawa and Ngāti Maniapoto), QSM. Bronwyn is a community representative on the Board. Bronwyn has a BA in Political Studies and Māori Studies. Bronwyn has worked in the community education and voluntary sector, primarily in the area of adult literacy, for over 20 years as a tutor, literacy coordinator, national trainer and manager.

In 1991 Bronwyn was appointed Te Apiha Kaiwhakahaere o Te Motu of the ARLA Federation (now Literacy Aotearoa Inc.). Since 2005, Bronwyn has operated as Te Tumuaki (sole Chief Executive Officer) of Literacy Aotearoa. Literacy Aotearoa, a Treaty based organisation, is the largest national network of adult literacy providers throughout New Zealand.

Prue Kapua (Ngāti Whakaue, Te Arawa and Ngāti Kahungunu). Prue is the National President of Te Roopu Wahine Maori Toko i te Ora (the Maori Women's Welfare League); WHO Compliance Panel (MOH), Chair; Tekau ma rua, member; NZCCSS Family and Policy Group, member; Breast Cancer Foundation NZ, Trustee, and is a highly experienced lawyer with expertise in resource management law, Treaty issues and litigation, family and medico legal-issues and is Principal of Tamatekapua Law.

Bayden Barber (Ngāti Kahungunu, Ngāpuhi and Ngai Tahu). Bayden is a business consultant; Chair of Health Hawke's Bay PHO; an elected member of the Hastings District Council; Trustee of Te Mata Park Trust; Director of Takitimu Ora; and Chair of Hawke's Bay Health Alliance.

Whether at secondary school or a tertiary institute, trying to meet educational costs is a struggle for many. Whānau of secondary students face the cost of uniforms, fees and equipment costs, often for multiple children.

For numerous tertiary graduates, the reality of obtaining a degree comes with a hefty financial burden – a student loan – especially for students whose planned careers require a postgraduate degree, such as medicine or law.

Each scholarship administered by the Trust has its own specific criteria; students apply for those scholarships where they believe they meet the criteria, which may include:

- whakapapa;
- financial need;
- academic merit;
- field of study (e.g. business, science, law, agriculture);
- course of study the previous year;
- specific secondary school or tertiary institution attended.

Scholarship income comes from three sources:

- i. Trust investment;
- ii. capital trusts in which donors have provided capital sums to endow scholarships; and
- iii. income trusts where the Trust receives income from an external source.

A scholarship subsidy provided by the Ministry of Education is an arrangement started when the Foundation was formed in 1961. The current annual cap on this is \$664,000. The Trust also receives an administration grant from the Ministry to assist with the management and disbursement of scholarships.

When it comes to providing scholarships to students undertaking study, it was an amazing year for the Trust. More than 1,000 scholarships were awarded to students enrolled in post-primary education, valued at more than \$1.3M.

Moving forward

Areas on which the Trust concentrated over the past year included:

- **Strategic relationships** – strengthened and established relationships with key stakeholders to extend networks.
- **Ministry of Education** – focussed on fulfilling obligations to the Ministry with a four-year funding agreement secured.
- **Policies and procedures** – reviewed and moderated performance in line with the Trust's policies and procedures, to ensure the Trust provides the best possible service to its stakeholders, including the Ministry, donors, students and their whānau.
- **Website development** – to be completed this year.
- **Investment strategy** – to ensure the Trust accesses the best possible return on investments, in order to grow its financial base.
- **Audit completion** – 2017 and 2018 audits were completed in advance of anticipated completion dates.

To identify areas of focus for the 2018 – 2021 period, the Board has identified four pou which will guide development over the next three years:

- Pou 1: Ko Te Mana Ko Te Kupu
Scholarship growth and development
- Pou 2: He Toka Tū Moana
Financial sustainability and growth
- Pou 3: Ngākau Mahiki
Research
- Pou 4: Pōwhiri

Financial results

The 2018 financial results for the Trust show the Board continues to move to greater financial stability and certainty. For the 2018 year, the Trust's net assets were \$9.2M (\$9.3M in 2017), with investments of \$8.8M (\$7.5M in 2017).

It is accurate to say that recipients appreciated and were rightly proud to be awarded a scholarship. No matter the scholarship amount, scholarships were meaningful and made a difference to the lives of students.

Scholarships not only relieve the impact of increasing education costs, but reduce pressure on students and their whānau, enable students to focus on their studies and lessen the need for tertiary students to take out student loans.

An unprecedented number of thank you letters and academic results were received this year from scholarship recipients.

Academic results confirm the value of the Trust's work and indicate the commitment of students to their studies. Students see themselves as role models within whānau, hapū and iwi, and are proud to wear the mantle placed upon them.

"I am the first child in my whānau to come to university, therefore, I use this as motivation to remain persistent to keep working hard and achieve higher through my studies."

"I have a strong desire to pass and succeed and show my children that you are never too old to learn, grow and keep gaining new skills."

"It is my hope that my tertiary journey will inspire my whānau to strive for higher education, and it is my dream to one day be able to help mentor my younger whānau through their own tertiary journeys."

"The scholarship will be a huge help towards our increased living costs due to me going to school. The scholarship will help pay for my architecture materials costs and before and after school care for my two boys..."

"I was particularly over the moon when my husband and I were able to budget and use part of the funds for a Littman Master Cardiology Stethoscope. A piece of nursing equipment I have wished for a very long time."
