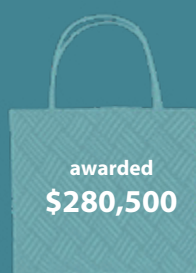

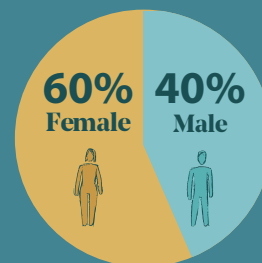
## Number receiving assistance

\* This data show scholarships awarded annually. The Trust also provides some discretionary assistance which can vary from year to year depending on funds available.

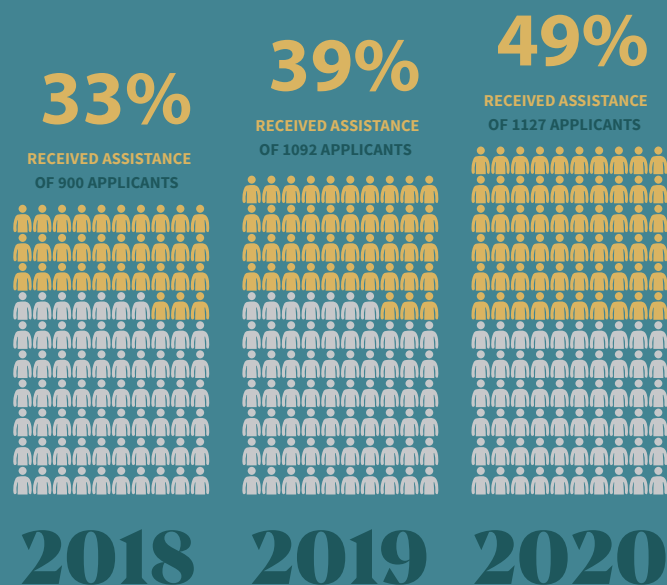
## Gender

A higher proportion of applicants has received assistance in each of the last three years while the number of applicants has also risen in each of those years.



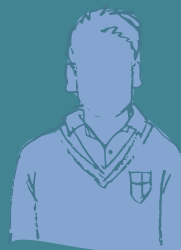

# How do we fund assistance to rangatahi?

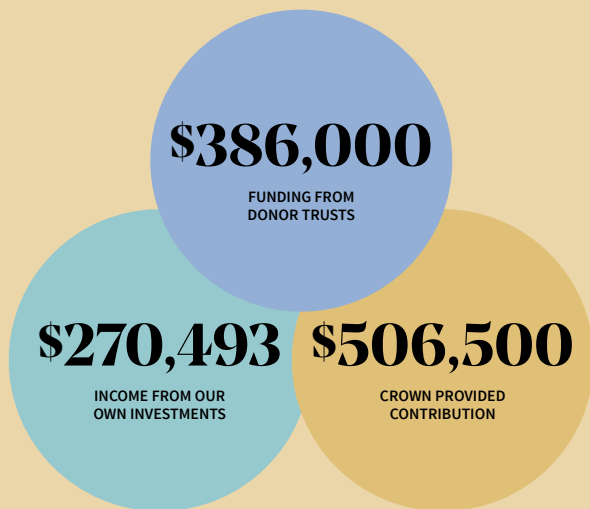

## SIR JOHN BENNETT

Sir John Bennett (Ngāti Whakaue, Ngāti Pikiao) served six terms as Chair of the Trust and the Trust's predecessor, the Māori Education Foundation. As a young man, Sir John, the son of Arihia Ngārangioue Hēmana and Frederic Bennett the first Bishop of Aotearoa, survived the collapse of the Napier public library during the devastating earthquake of 1931 before beginning his training as a school teacher in Christchurch. He was also a long serving chairman of Te Kōhanga Reo Trust and chairman of the Nature Conservation Council. The two scholarships established in his honour are for postgraduate studies towards an honours or Master degree and a doctorate.





# Student Profiles

## Evelyn Leef



Explaining the impact of receiving the Roy Watling Mitchell Prestigious Professions Scholarship, young educationalist Evelyn Leef (Te Rarawa, Ngāpuhi) told us, “ This scholarship allowed me to focus on my studies and relieved the financial pressure to travel

and pay fees. It has extended my knowledge in education and leadership which I can now share with my colleagues and students. My efforts are to prove to all Māori that regardless of where you come from, the challenges you may face, you can achieve anything you set your mind to. “

“Being Māori is my motivation, my family is my purpose and I am continuously inspired by the young people I am privileged to work with.”

Prior to taking up the scholarship Evelyn had completed a BA and a Dip Tchg, a Master in Education and the scholarship has allowed her to complete a MedL (Master of Educational Leadership) to further her career in education.

## Chad Kahukiwa



Chad Kahukiwa (Ngāti Porou) was supported during Year 13 at Wainuiomata High School by a Trust scholarship. He completed Level 3 NCEA while captaining the basketball team and being named 2020 MVP.

Chad is now working until such time he is able to commence trade training in the building industry in 2021.

## Zivana Hammond-Walker



In thanking the Trust for the award of the Norman Kirk Memorial Scholarship to pursue and undergraduate degree, Zivana Hammond Walker (Ngāti Porou) quoted Norman Kirk's own words and said the scholarship has provided her with the four components of a healthy

life identified by the former Prime Minister: “safety, self-respect, sustenance and aspiration. I can afford to heat my flat, clean my clothes and buy healthy food. These three factors have allowed me to have space and freedom to hope.” “Ehara taku toa, he takitahi, he toa takitini.”

Zivana is studying for a Bachelors degree in Environment and Society.

## Ngarongo Ormsby



Ngarongo Ormsby (Ngāti Maniapoto, Ngāti Ngutu, Rakaunui) is leading a very full life while studying towards a PhD in indigenous studies at Te Whare Wānanga ō Awanuiārangi which he hopes to complete in 2022.

A mature student, Ngarongo is actively involved as a kaumatua/ringawera and kaitiaki on his marae; is a whānau member representative on the Hapū runanga; represents his Hapū on the Tauranga Moana Māori Trust Board, and in advancing his profession (family dispute resolution) advocating and advancing Māori interests.

‘My PhD is important... it brings a Māori worldview lens where Pākehā methodologies and theories have dominated the industry. The assumptions made is ‘one sock’ methodology works for all inclusive of diverse other cultures. I aim to change the landscape and it's already happening.”



# 2020 in review

## CHAIRPERSON

The 2020 financial year had many positive elements for the Trust.

We continued the trend of providing assistance to more taura than in the previous year – 300 in 2018, 428 in 2019 and 561 in 2020.

We are also steadily increasing the percentage of applicants we assist from 33% in 2018 to 49% in 2020.

This year we also decided to extend the range of scholarships the Trust supports from its own funds, increasing our assistance to senior secondary school taura, introducing a scholarship for young women who aspire to non-traditional trade apprenticeships, and initiating two postgraduate scholarships in honour of our much loved and long serving Chairperson, the distinguished educationalist, Sir John Bennett.

This year the Trust has also seen a declining trend in funding from traditional donors and lower returns on the Trust's own investment funds. These lower returns have been driven by factors beyond the control of both our donors and the Trust, as we all experience an economic environment characterised by very low and decreasing returns from traditional low risk investments. While we can bridge the gap by using our reserves to supplement the funds we distribute, Trustees recognise this is unsustainable over the medium and long term.

One response of the Trust to this investment environment will be to seek additional funding from possible new partners over the coming year. The Board believes there is considerable potential to access additional funding both from individual donors, including past recipients of assistance, and organisations that have seen the value in increasing the number and range of Māori in the private sector. In addition, we believe the time is right to look again at the Crown funding to the Trust for scholarship and administrative assistance. Our current agreement expires in 2021 and we will be discussing possibilities with the Ministry of Education early next year.



Independent of the funding issue, the Trust will also be looking to take an increasingly strategic approach to assistance in the future. We believe that we must look more closely where our funding can make the greatest difference for Māori and direct our assistance to those areas more precisely. Once the Trust was the main form of assistance to taura seeking secondary and tertiary education. With Iwi who have received Treaty settlements providing educational assistance to their members, this is no longer the case and points to a more specialised role for the Trust in the future if we are to make the most of the resources we have. This may include offering our experience in scholarship management to Iwi and Hapū post-settlement governance groups.

The Trust will also farewell at the end of the 2020 calendar year our long serving General Manager, Evelyn Newman, who joined us in 2009 as an executive assistant and quickly moved into a much more responsible role. Evelyn has willingly, and with stoicism, carried the responsibilities of management of the Trust through some very tough years as we unwound our farming businesses, stabilised the financial position of the Trust and built the foundation for our future. Evelyn will always be known for her tenacity, spectacular efficiency, and phenomenal management of the Trust. Most simply, Evelyn's passion and belief in our Māori taura abilities to succeed has constantly demonstrated our values in practice. We will forever appreciate her contribution to the Trust. At my request she has agreed to leave us with some departing thoughts below.

Finally, I would like to thank my fellow Board members for their commitment and hard work on behalf of the Trust in 2020. The work of the Board to fortify and extend the opportunities and sustainability of the Trust are sincerely acknowledged and appreciated.

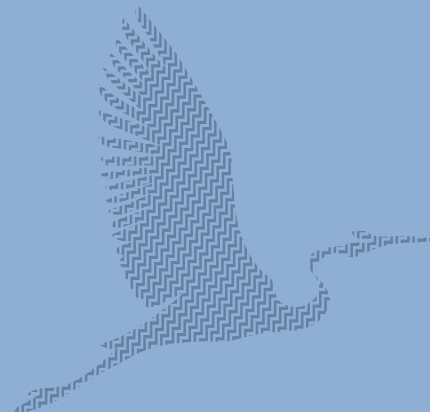
