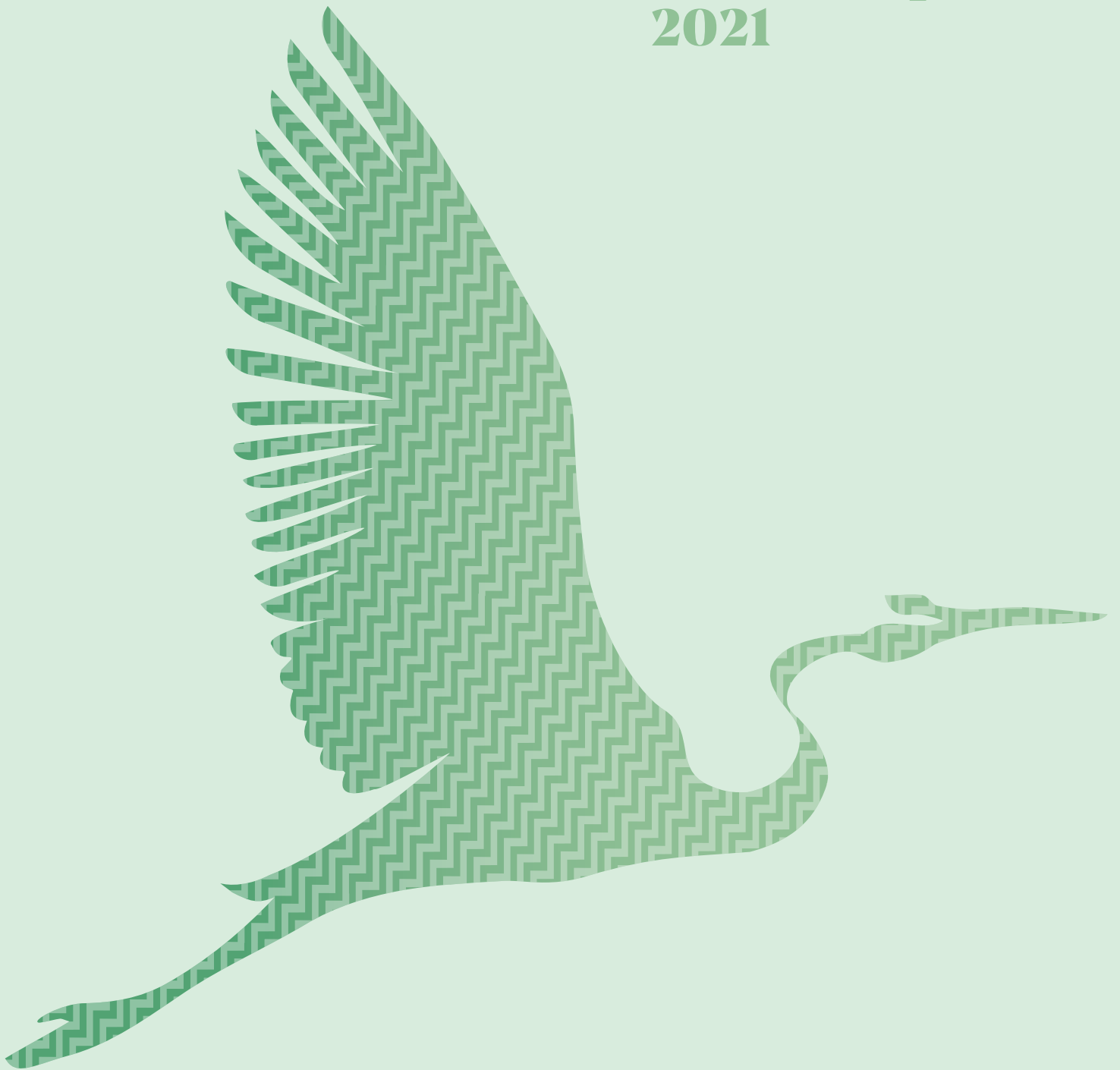

## Bronwyn Yates, Chairperson's Report

---

The 2021 financial year has seen a continuation of the invigoration and developments reported in the 2020 Annual Report.

We acknowledge our staff, retiring General Manager, Evelyn Newman, our new General Manager, as from April 2021, John Cribb, and our administrator, Amy Ririnui. The dedication and drive our team shows the Trust is a demonstration of their deep commitment to Māori learners and whānau. The Board acknowledges with sincere appreciation, their hard work, energy and aspirations for the Trust and our people, whom we are here to serve.

Following on from last year, where we reported that the Trust had extended support of scholarships from its own funds, it is very pleasing to advise that we have entered into a number of co-ventures with Iwi and other new and engaged stakeholders. The value of these partnerships will result in new scholarships, and most importantly grow the reach of our scholarships to more learners.

It is important that the Trust advocates for the best access, support and opportunities of excellent education for Māori. The impact of the COVID-19

pandemic and the vulnerability of our communities dictate that increased sources of funding, and reach for educational scholarship to Māori are vital. For this year we are pleased that we continue the increased assistance - 772 students awarded a total of \$1,049,868, building on the 561 students awarded \$794,999 in 2020.

From 2020, the Trust went through a robust process to find an investment firm that reflected our values, ethics and needs. In the end, we decided on Forsyth Barr, and it is pleasing to report that this year, the portfolio earned the Trust income of \$332,091.

Our final development to report on is the partnership we have established with Tribal, a company that provides software and services that empower the world of education. Together we are building software to support our scholarship applications. We will launch the package December 2021.

I thank my fellow Board members for their continued commitment and hard work on behalf of the Trust. They are a very inspiring team, and it is their rigour and high standards that have built the Trust's strength in governance and strategic leadership. I also acknowledge the voluntary services of Michael Chamberlain as the external appointment on the Audit, Risk and Investment. Michael provides technical investment and financial advice to the Trust, and shares the dreams for the Trust's work.

Appointed Chairperson of the Trust in November 2018, Bronwyn is a community representative on the Board. Bronwyn has a BA in Political Studies and Māori Studies.

Bronwyn has worked in the community education and voluntary sector, primarily in the area of adult literacy, for the over 30 years as a tutor, literacy coordinator and national trainer and manager. In 1991 Bronwyn was appointed Te Apiha Kaiwhakahaere o Te Motu of the ARLA Federation (now Literacy Aotearoa Inc.) in a joint CEO position. Since 2005, Bronwyn has operated as Te Tumuaki (sole Chief Executive Officer) of Literacy Aotearoa.

Literacy Aotearoa, a Treaty based organisation, is the largest national network of adult literacy providers throughout New Zealand. The annual average number of students enrolled each year is 7,000 and over 1,500 volunteers and paid personnel deliver the two core business activities of the organisation, namely literacy tuition and tutor training.

She is a highly experienced lawyer with expertise in resource management law, Treaty issues and litigation, family and medico legal-issues. Prue is Principal of Tamatekapua Law.

Tupara brings over 30 years of executive and governance experience in the health, tertiary education, research and innovation, tourism, and Iwi development sectors. He was a foundation trustee of Ngāti Whakaue Assets Trust in 2009 leaving in 2012 after being appointed inaugural Chief Executive of Ngāti Whātua Orākei Whai Maia Ltd.

Tupara is currently the Te Kurutao Regional Manager – Tāmaki Tai Tokerau at Kainga Ora leading a team of 8 people and undertaking the critical role of connecting urban development and housing supply teams at Kāinga Ora with Iwi, Hāpu, Marae, Māori Authorities, and Māori entities across the region from Te Rerenga Wairua in the north to Pokeno in the south.

Tupara is also a director on six (6) other organisations – the NZ Māori Arts and Crafts Institute, industry training organisation Competenz, state owned enterprise MetService, tertiary education providers Wellington Institute of Technology and Whitireia Community Polytechnic, and civil infrastructure services provider Infra Core. He has well developed relationships and networks in a number of key sectors nationally as well as with local Government bodies and central Government ministries and agencies.

Tupara's technical skills are in governance, financial management, bicultural strategy, business development and strategic partnerships.

I joined the Māori Education Trust in April 2021 following the retirement of Evelyn Newman. Covid has put a lot more demand on our students; not only are they working hard to achieve educational success but also to ensure they can support their whānau. With the support of the Board through the many scholarships they provide and the willingness to partner with Iwi, Māori Land Trusts, Sponsors, and Education Institutions it has given us the ability to focus on delivering the most benefit for our students.

In the short time leading up to the end of the Trust's 2021 financial year, several Iwi were approached along with many Māori Land Trusts, which created new partners this year; some are listed throughout our Annual Report. The new year 2022 looks very promising with over 15 Iwi, 23 Land Trusts, three (3) new sponsors and two (2) universities currently negotiating to give support towards scholarships for Secondary, Undergraduate and Postgraduate students.

With these new partners and changes that the Board have developed, it will again be able to use its experience as a scholarship provider and look at the wider issues connected with the role of education in Māori development. Victoria University (Te Herenga Waka) was introduced to us and within a short period of time, we have managed to jointly fund over 120 new scholarships. Their system is simple and easy to implement and we look forward to being able to share their ideas with our new partners.

The past two (2) years has brought significant changes to Aotearoa, our whānau and many of our rangatahi. We are not beyond the challenges yet, but we must continue to build on our experience and strengthen our relationships with our new Partners, supporting aspirations of our rangatahi who are seeking higher education opportunities.

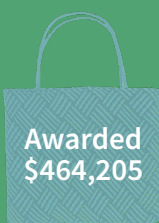

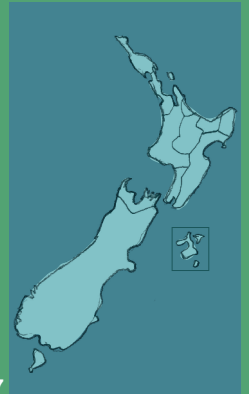

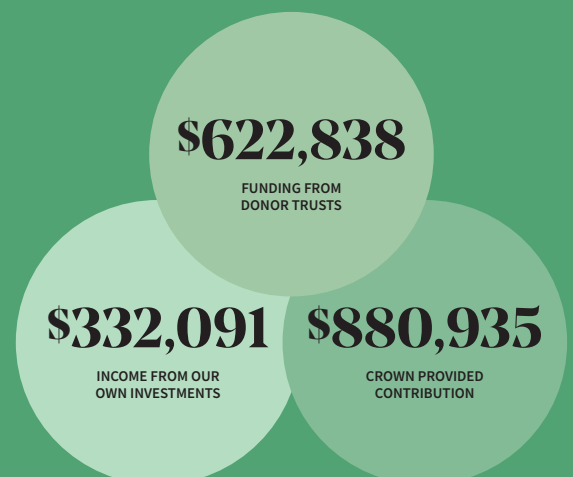
The Māori Education Trust provides financial assistance to Māori undertaking secondary or tertiary study. Applicants can record their whakapapa with up to three Iwi.

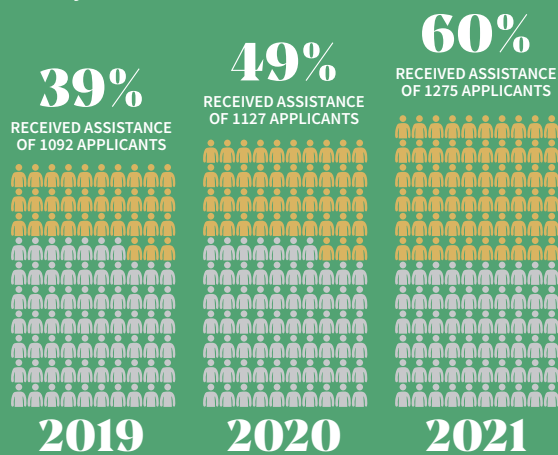


## Across Aotearoa New Zealand

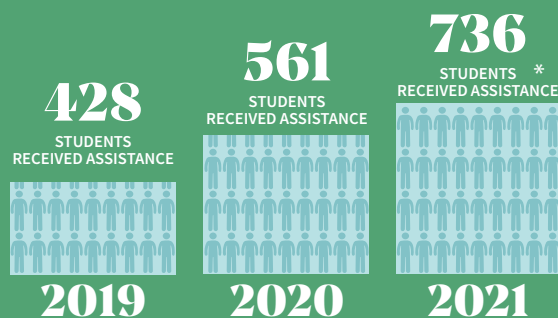
### Proportion Receiving Assistance

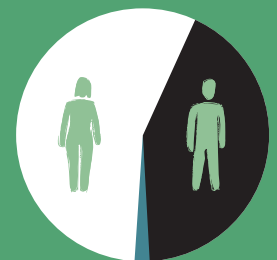

### Gender

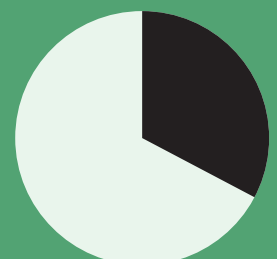

# Taihonoa Partnership Grows Student Benefits

Te Herenga Waka—Victoria University of Wellington and the Māori Education Trust are excited to present a new innovation and partnership for 2021. Growing the range and value of scholarships offered to tauira Māori attending Te Herenga Waka, this arrangement has brought new opportunities for the Māori Education Trust and the Office of the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Māori) to work in collaboration and enhance the University's Taihonoa programme.

Together, the Māori Education Trust and Te Herenga Waka were able to offer four dual scholarships - which doubled the funding for recipients - totalling \$216,400.00 in scholarships distributed. In addition, the Māori Education Trust and Te Herenga Waka have also arranged a series of tripartite scholarships with eight of Te Herenga Waka's Taihonoa Iwi partners. The combined value of these joint scholarships was \$259,268.49 which benefitted 148 deserving Māori students. The collective impact of this new partnership has proved invaluable in providing total funding of \$475,668.49 to Māori students studying at Te Herenga Waka.

# Ngāti Whakaue Education Endowment Trust Board

The Ngāti Whakaue Education Endowment Trust Board (NWEET) is delighted to partner with the Māori Education Trust and Te Herenga Waka - Victoria University of Wellington, to financially support students who whakapapa to Ngāti Whakaue and are attending Te Herenga Waka - Victoria University of Wellington.

NWEET is a statutory Board with Charitable Trust status. This endowment was established in 1880 by the iwi of Ngāti Whakaue through the gifting of land for the purposes of secondary education in Rotorua. In October 1995, through a Crown/Iwi settlement process the Reserves and other Lands and Disposal Act 1995 vested all the assets of the former Rotorua High Schools Board in NWEET. The composition of NWEET and purpose of the endowment were amended to give Ngāti Whakaue control and to apply its funds for the general purposes of education. In the year ended 31 December 2020 NWEET distributed education grants totalling \$1,538,731 and the net value of its assets at that date was \$74,959,351.

The NWEET Board's Mission is to enhance the legacy of Ngāti Whakaue Tūpuna by the responsible and effective management of the endowment, and the provision of financial support to the beneficiaries of the Trust for Education purposes, that add value and benefit to our community.

# TupuToa Internship Programme

TupuToa seeks to ensure corporate Aotearoa is representative of our country, by developing and empowering our people and building the cultural capability of our partners. We recognize the need to develop an overall pipeline of Māori and Pacific talent – from the student stage to experienced professionals to executive leaders. We are now designing, developing and implementing a pathway of programmes which meet the needs of our people at the different stages of their career.

TupuToa's strategy to achieve our vision of a more prosperous country with strong and resilient Māori and Pacific leaders aligns well with that of government, our partners and funders. We want our rangatahi to have the widest opportunities to grow and reach their full potential. Our kaupapa enhances organisations understanding of Māori and Pacific culture, enabling community-led economic development for communities most affected by income inequalities; and strengthening social cohesion within and between corporates and communities. We believe Aotearoa needs leaders who are culturally intelligent, innovative, creative and internationally connected. However, Māori and Pacific people are underrepresented in corporate and professional sectors at all levels.

Our programme runs from March through to the following February. Engagement across tertiary institutions commence in March with applications opening around the same time. A comprehensive process to advance applicants through a number of assessments and workshops to final matching is implemented by the navigation team. The process is high touch and student centric, with a focus on building strong relationships. Each applicant is able to gain new learnings and skills, even if they are not matched to an internship opportunity.

TupuToa have partnered up with the Māori Education Trust to support students who are interested in accessing an internship programme. Students can make contact with TupuToa through their scholarship application, should they wish to engage or request more information about the internship programme.
